### Veterans Corner by Terri Coleman



Update on our Veterans: Due to the slow process of the government bureaucracy and as reported by the

Senate Committee on Veterans Affairs, our troops are now waiting **TEN MONTHS**, on the average, for their first disability check to arrive after they leave the hospital or being discharged from the Service. Presently, we have about 48,000 troops in Afghanistan and more are returning home wounded each week. This is sad news for all of us.

#### What have the Elks done in 2016-2017 for our Veterans?

- 138,294 Elks gave 1,072,471 hours of service to our Veterans
- Elks donated 54,279 square feet of leather (Veterans Leather Program) to the Help Heal Vets Program to manufacture craft kits
- The total value of Elks service in 2016-2017 is estimated at \$40,815,147.00
- Elks supported 19,682 military members and their families through the Army of Hope.

**“The Minutes that Matter Program”** is a non-profit organization serving troops with free conversation. The program was founded by Robbie and Brittany Bergquist at the age of 12 and 13. “Cell phones for Soldiers” accepts all makes models and conditions of cell phones. New, used, broken or cracked, smart and cell phones”. Each donated device will provide troops with 2.5 hours of Free Talk Time. Lets do our part! If you are like me, you have old smart or cell phones that are outdated/broken in the junk drawer. I have provided a container, at the lodge, for these devices and hope you will gather yours up and bring them in for the continued support the Elks provide .

#### **VETERANS STANDDOWN**

**Please remember the Stand-Down** coming up in October keep the donation box, in the lobby, flowing with items for our Vets. Also, as you travel this summer save all the hotel/motel soaps, lotions, etc. Each year, at the Stand-Down, a gentleman arrives with a homemade portable shower. He goes through the homeless areas in the desert and gives showers. He appreciates the toiletries the Elks provide for him to use. I want to recommend that all Veterans go to the Veterans Reporter News and read the articles regarding TRICARE and the bills that are before the Senate and the House. “keep an eye on what’s being done” .....

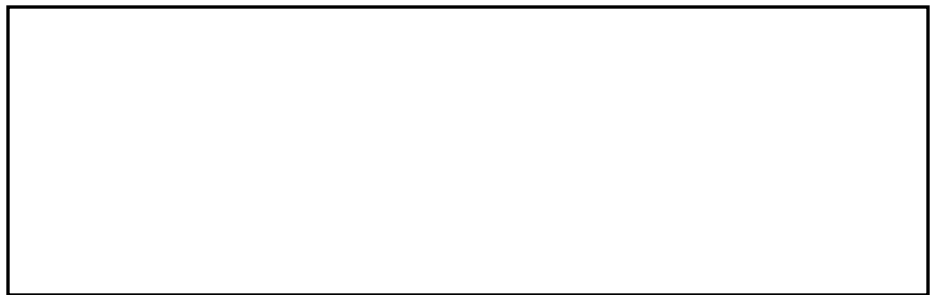
